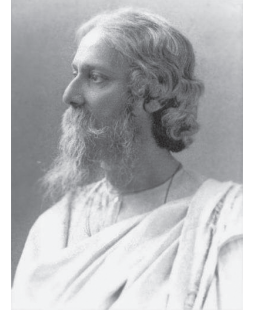

* Holidays are subject to change. They will be notified as and when there is a change. Parents are requested not to plan for the vacations without confirmation from the school about the dates of examinations and vacations.

RULES & REGULATIONS

All rules and regulations are formulated for the benefit of the students. We owe it to them to have a chance to grow up in a society that is safe, and to learn in an environment where there is respect for all. All rules apply to all students / parents to whom they are applicable. The following school rules focus on some specific issues and do not cover every eventuality; they allow the exercise of common sense and ethics to resolve such contingencies. Everyone must get acquainted with the rules and regulations of the school besides the timely instructions given by the school authorities through public announcements or by notices issued by the principal. Ignorance of rules will not be accepted as an excuse.

DRESS CODE POLICY

All children should be smartly and neatly dressed at all times in our designated school uniform. Personal cleanliness and hygiene is a must. Uniform should be properly washed and ironed along with appropriate shoes, socks, belt, tie, shoulder flaps etc

- ★ Shabby / Unkempt / Long / Fancy haircuts are not allowed.
- ★ (For Girls) Hair beyond shoulder length should be neatly plaited. No fancy hairpins, hair clips or hair bands are allowed. If bands are used, they should be brown / grey / white in colour according to their uniform.
- ★ Hair should not fall on the forehead and highlighting / hair colour is not allowed.
- ★ Wearing fancy, expensive jewellery, wristwatches etc is not encouraged.
- ★ Wearing earrings is not allowed. Girls are allowed to wear only small tops / studs.
- ★ Nails should be trimmed and cleaned.
- ★ Applying nail polish / mehendi / tattoos is not allowed.
- ★ *Wearing of slippers (Rubber / Hawaii model) is not allowed on any day at any time inside the school.*

UNIFORM

Uniform is meant to show that all students are equal. Students should take pride in wearing school uniform.

Parents should see that their son / daughter comes to school in the prescribed uniform failing which, he / she is liable to be sent back home. The school does not take any responsibility for them in such situations.

HOUSE SYSTEM

For effective management and discipline of students and to create and foster 'esprit de corps' (spirit of unity) among them, a house system has been developed in school.

The students are divided into four houses, distinguished by four colours: Red, Green, Blue and Yellow. A healthy competition is encouraged among them to achieve excellence and to develop higher qualities of leadership. All the four houses are equal and students are divided on a random basis to ensure equal number of students in each house in each class. Therefore, no discussion regarding the house colour is entertained by the student / parent.

LEAVE RULES

In case of need for leave, a written request signed by the parent must be submitted in advance. Leave will be granted only on valid and serious reasons. The same should be recorded in the hand book in the leave record page and signed by the Parent. When the student returns to school this should be countersigned by the principal / class teacher and produced before entering the class.

If due to unavoidable reasons one could not apply for leave and the student was absent, on his return, a letter of apology for the absence should be submitted to the principal along with the entry and signature of the parent in the page for the absence record and the signature of the principal / class teacher obtained before entering the class. If the child is on leave due to ill health, a medical certificate should be produced along with the leave letter.

TUITIONS

Private tuitions are generally discouraged. It may spoil the studious nature of the student in classrooms. Untrained / unqualified tutors can impose a heavy burden on the students, wasting their energy and time and at the same time causing an additional financial burden on parents. Even the qualified tutors may not be aware of the actual methodology followed in the school and they may teach in their own methods causing greater confusion to students. If it is absolutely necessary, parents may make arrangements for private tuition with the suggestions of the Incharge.

DISTRIBUTION OF WRITTEN / PRINTED MATERIALS

- ★ No written material should be distributed to other parents, teachers and students directly.
- ★ Any written material to be distributed should be handed over to the Principal
- ★ No article liable to be a source of disturbance should be brought to School.
- ★ No Story books or periodicals from outside should be brought to the school unless approved by the In-Charge/Class teacher.

DIARY / HANDBOOK

The Diary / the hand book issued to every student at the beginning of the year is to be brought to school everyday, failing which he / she may not be admitted to class. They should be kept neat and tidy all through the year. Students are not allowed to write anything in them except as directed in the various pages. They must be kept safely throughout the year.

BOOKS / MATERIAL

The Notebooks / textbooks are to be bought at school as prescribed.

LOSS OF BOOKS, MONEY ETC

Students are advised to take care of their belongings. Loss of books, pens, clothes, money and other articles is the responsibility of the student. Books and other property must be marked with the owner's name as far as possible. The school does not accept the responsibility for the loss of pupil's books, pens, money, etc

LIBRARY

Library books are to be taken care of and used properly. While taking a book out, any defect or damage on it must be brought to the notice of the staff immediately. Any damage or loss of the book will have to be made good with a fine in addition to the cost of the book.

One book will be issued to the students at a time. This book can be kept for one week, at the end of which it is to be promptly returned. Book can also be renewed for another week. Fine will be levied on books returned late. Books will be issued only at specific times notified for each class. Reference books will not be issued out of the library. They can be issued for reference only inside the library room.

FIELD TRIPS / TOURS

Study tours are part of study and class activity and hence all are expected to join them. It is meant to encourage and strengthen friendliness and love for each other. It is also meant to provide relaxation and to develop knowledge of places and people.

School management or staff will not be held responsible for any accident or mishap during picnics, tours, field trips or sporting activities. A written request from the parent should be given to the principal through class teachers one day before they start, if anyone is not interested in such trips.

No meeting, party or picnic or any kind of organized school activity shall be arranged without the prior approval of the school authorities.

COMPETITIONS

Several competitions such as Quiz, elocution, recitation, sports, dance, etc. are conducted in school. Students are also prepared for district, state and national level competitions conducted by reputed and authentic organizations. Wherever possible, the competitions in school are so structured that each student is provided an opportunity to participate in it. Where as when limited number of students are required to participate in competitions outside school, the best performers are selected on the basis of their known performance and past experience.

EXAMINATIONS

In the event of a student missing his/her assessment due to his/her absence from the school, there shall be no re-test or re-assessment and the student shall be awarded an average grade for that particular assessment except for the annual examination. No retest will be conducted for those who absent themselves from any test/examination. However average mark of a subject is granted to a child who could not attend any examination due to severe illness for promotion. The marks awarded in such cases will not be considered for deciding ranks/academic awards, but only for promotions.

Strict action will be taken against students using unfair means in examination.

PROMOTION

The norms of promotion are fixed by the management. Promotion depends on the marks scored in the tests and the examinations and also on the internal assessment based on attendance, homework, class-work, composition, general discipline etc. Granting admission to a student in any class doesn't mean that he / she should be promoted to the next higher class at the end of the academic year. The school doesn't guarantee promotion to any student.

GIFTS / DONATIONS

Distribution of sweets/gifts on birthdays should be limited. No student is allowed to bring gifts, presents, etc. to school to mark his/her /other's birthday or for any other occasion. A student will be

allowed to distribute 2 toffees / wafers etc. per student / staff in his/her section.

Collections and donations of any kind for any purpose are not permitted, unless authorized by the Incharge.

Parents are earnestly requested not to make any personal gifts to staff members / management.

NOTE TO STUDENTS

All students must :

- ★ Behave in a courteous, decent and modest manner, appropriate to school culture at all times.
- ★ Demonstrate honesty and integrity; therefore lying, cheating and stealing of any kind must be shunned.
- ★ Try to achieve their personal best in their studies and be scrupulously honest in all academic activities.
- ★ Contribute to a positive learning atmosphere in class by co-operating with the teacher, getting work done on time, contribution to discussions and avoiding disruptions.
- ★ Show proper care and regard for school property (building, equipment, furniture, fittings, books, etc.) as well as the property of others.
- ★ Make themselves available to represent the school in sporting and cultural activities and to attend training sessions / rehearsals when required.
- ★ Dispose the litter in the dustbins provided, flush the toilets after use, move in proper lines, converse only in English and obey other school rules and norms
- ★ “Zero tolerance” policy in the following areas:
 - Bullying, fighting, vulgarity or verbal intimidation. Vandalism or theft.
- ★ Offensive language or possession of offensive literature / images in any form.
- ★ Disruption of lesson / activity through inappropriate behavior.
- ★ Use of Cell phones, I – pods, FM radios, laser pointers, e – gadgets, etc in the school premises. Any such item found in the possession of a student in the school premises will be confiscated.
- ★ Chewing of gum is prohibited in the school premises.
- ★ It is forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
- ★ No shouting or whistling is allowed in or around the school building. Running in corridors is strictly prohibited.
- ★ It is strictly forbidden to throw any object at any one.
- ★ Students should not leave the School during the working hours unless if he/she falls sick or hurts himself / herself. This leave can be granted with the permission of the Incharges only.
- ★ Students using school vans should follow the rules mentioned
- ★ The school diary & handbook has to be brought to the school every day.

Every student is entrusted with the responsibility of informing the Director/ Incharge should they see others violating this policy.

A violation of any rule may result in disciplinary action including, but not limited to:

Compensatory payment of charges / Assigned work related to the offense / Detention / in-school suspension / out-of-school suspension / Expulsion. Bicycles must be kept locked. A nominal annual fee is to be paid and get a number painted to keep the cycle in the stand. All the cycles in the stand will be chained together which will be removed only during the designated timings.

WILL HAVE TO ACCEPT THE CONSEQUENCES**

NOTE TO PARENTS

Timings: Incharge : 11.00 AM to 12 NOON and 5.00 PM to 6.00 PM on all working days or by prior appointment.

* In case of emergency, the Principal can be contacted at any point of time during school hours.

- ★ When a student is admitted in the school, the parents / guardians will be deemed to have gone through and accepted all the rules and regulations of the school.
- ★ Only father, mother or one nominated guardian should come to school to discuss the progress of their ward with the staff / management.
- ★ Parents and guardians are requested to read and explain the school rules to their wards.
- ★ Parents are requested to pay special attention to the personal cleanliness and turnout of their children apart from conformity to the prescribed dress code. They are also requested to ensure that the child is punctual to the school.
- ★ Parents are requested not to enter classrooms to see their children or teachers during the school hours without the permission from office staff / Incharge. They can meet the teachers and discuss the progress of their wards on every Saturday afternoon designated times. They are also requested to attend Parents' Meetings without fail.
- ★ Parents are required to inform the school office if there is any change in their address and telephone numbers.
- ★ Parent's attention is drawn to the fact that the criticism of the school or teacher in the presence of a child should be strictly avoided because it causes the students to lose respect for their teachers with the consequent failure to learn from them and retards their progress.
- ★ The answer sheets / progress report will be given within a week after the completion of the examinations. Parents should contact the Incharge in case if their children don't show them in time. Parents should sign the progress report card and return it to the school within three days. If lost / mutilated, a replacement will be made after the payment of the required fine of Rs. 20 at the office. Also parents are advised not to see the progress card strictly as a bench mark or scale of students growth.
- ★ Parents are required to co-operate with the school in its attempt to help their children progress by paying attention to their attendance, punctuality and discipline and to take interest in their child's work. They should check the diary / handbook every day and note the instructions given. They are advised to check the bags of their wards to see if any circular / notice / invitation etc. has been issued.
- ★ The ward of those parents who avoid meeting the authorities, when advised to do so, may not be allowed to attend the classes.
- ★ If any student is suffering with contagious / infectious disease, the principal should be informed and the child should not be sent to the school. Sometimes, a medical certificate might be required to allow the student into classroom.
- ★ Students are expected to leave the school premises as soon as the school gets over. They are not supposed to stay back. Please ensure that vehicles pick them up immediately. Please instruct your child not to leave the school premises if his / her auto-rickshaw or personal vehicle does not arrive to take him / her back home. The student must remain within the premises and inform the supervisors/ office staff. The school will not take any responsibility if the children leave the campus without intimation.

- ★ Parents should not deal with any dispute arising between the students. It can be reported to the principal but should be left to the school staff to resolve the matter.
- ★ Parents are requested to take care of the school library books brought home.
- ★ Any damage to the school property caused by a student should be compensated by the parent concerned.
- ★ Parents are requested to remember and make school fee payments in time and not to cause any disturbance to the student in this aspect.
- ★ The school does not take responsibility for safety of the vehicles of the parents.
- ★ On some special occasions, the students may be sent to watch / participate in programmes, exhibitions, competitions etc conducted by different organizations to enhance their knowledge / by the order of the district authorities. During such times, it is common that the program gets delayed when VIP's attend and the students might get stuck up at the venue. So, please understand that it is out of hands of the school authorities to bring the students back to school by the stipulated time during some occasions. However, information would be given to parents as and when necessary.
- ★ Parents are earnestly requested to ensure and encourage children to converse only in English at all times unless it is absolutely essential. Please mind that good fluency and command in English is necessary these days and that doesn't mean humiliating the mother tongue or the national language.
- ★ Parents are requested to understand that all the teaching / non-teaching staff / care-takers are employed with a view that they discharge their duties as expected and upkeep the high tone of the institute. However, the management cannot guarantee their personality / behaviour. So, the management's responsibility will be limited only to terminating their service in case of any uneventful incident caused by them.
- ★ Please note that the discipline of a child is essential to his / her personality development. The objective is to inculcate a sense of control, self-discipline and self-direction. Role of punishment is to reform and act as a deterrent. Hence corrective measures like imposition, monetary fines, physical punishments may be applied to little extent after vocabulary warnings. Parents should inform the Incharge and mention in the school diary in case of any physical / mental disabilities to avoid such punishments.

Any serious breach of discipline and above all discourtesy & disrespect to the members of the school-staff in anyway will be treated severely.

The Management reserves the right to expel any student at any time who in their opinion deserves such an action.

In spite of many efforts put by the staff / management, occurrence of incidents causing injuries to the students cannot be ruled out. However, First-Aid shall be provided as soon as possible and information is given to the parents. The school will not be responsible for any accident or mishap that may occur in the school premises and no claim in any matter is allowed.

AMENDMENTS OF RULES & REGULATIONS

The Management reserves the right to add, cancel, or amend these rules and regulations whenever necessary in furtherance of the aims and objectives of the School.
